3. Andrew Lee of CliftonLarsonAllen (CLA)

Mr. Lee from CLA joined the meeting via Zoom and apologized for not being able to join in person. He presented audit results for the Fiscal 22 audit. Mr. Lee went over the independent audit report, noting that CLA has issued an unmodified opinion for the College financial statements for fiscal year 2022. He added that an unmodified report is the highest level of assurance that they can provide as external auditors.

Mr. Lee reported on the findings noting the first three were related to material weakness in financial reporting. Two of the three findings were a repeat from the prior year. On the third finding,
